

Eighth Judicial District Court Case Reassignment Effective June 27

Effective Monday, June 27, 2011, a caseload reassignment involving District Court Civil/Criminal Division, will take effect. Below is a summary of the reassignment:

The entire caseload of District Court Department 5, recently vacated by Judge Jackie Glass, will be assigned to District Court Department 25 under Judge Kathleen Delaney.

- Judge Delaney will take over **all** of Judge Glass' former cases **including her Specialty Courts and Criminal dockets**. Department 25 will be located in Judge Glass' former Courtroom/Chambers 15A at the Regional Justice Center on the 15th floor.
- **The specialty calendars will continue to be heard under Judge Delaney in the same courtrooms as they were when Judge Glass presided.** Wednesday night Drug Court will continue to be heard in Courtroom 1A.

The entire caseload formerly handled by District Court Department 25 under Judge Delaney will be assigned to District Court Department 29 under Judge Susan Scann.

- Judge Scann will take over **all** of Judge Delaney's former cases including her Business Court and Civil dockets. Department 29 will be located in Judge Delaney's former Courtroom/Chambers on the 11th Floor of the Phoenix Building (330 S. Third St.).

The current civil caseload in District Court Department 29, formerly presided over by Judge Scann, will be randomly split between District Court Department 1 under Judge Kenneth Cory and District Court Department 5.

The District Court Department 1 criminal caseload, presided over by Judge Cory, will be reassigned to District Court Department 5. District Court Department 1 will become a full civil department.

Senior judges will temporarily preside in Department 5 until a replacement for Judge Glass is selected. District Court Department 5 will have a split calendar, hearing civil and criminal cases. Department 5 will conduct the criminal calendar on Monday and Wednesday beginning at 9 a.m. in RJC courtroom 16A. The civil calendar will be heard on Friday, beginning at 9 a.m. in courtroom 15B.

Effective June 27, any pending or future District Court matters, for reassigned cases, will be heard in the newly assigned department, unless otherwise identified in the case management system. **Please take note that efforts are being made to keep matters set as close to the original court date as possible, but it is very likely that dates will fluctuate.** We appreciate your understanding and flexibility in these circumstances.

In the event you have not exercised a peremptory challenge and wish to do so, you must exercise the peremptory challenge in accordance with Supreme Court Rule 48.1 and the case will be randomly reassigned.
