

Family Treatment Court

Family Treatment Court (FTC) is court supported substance use and mental health treatment for parents involved in the Child Welfare system. Our mission is to help parents overcome substance use and mental health problems that negatively impact the safety of their children. Our goal is to help parents reunify with their children and find long term recovery, family stability and happiness. Any parent/family with an open child welfare case who has an alcohol, substance use and/or mental health diagnosis is eligible for the program, with the possible exception of cases already referred for termination of parental rights proceedings.

Services Include:	Outpatient and Intensive Outpatient Substance Use and Mental Health Treatment In-Home Treatment Services Residential Treatment Case Management - Referrals for housing, job and transportation assistance. Medication Assisted Treatment Peer Parent Advocacy/Mentoring Drug Testing
Cost:	There is NO COST to the parents/participants.
Length of Stay:	The length of time in the program depends on how long it takes the parent to change their behavior and complete their individualized goals and DFS case plans. The average length of stay is eight to ten months.
