12	ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING THE ASSIGNMENT OF
13	MISDEMEANOR APPEALS FROM MUNICIPAL COURTS
	WHEREAS, the Eighth Judicial District Court Rule 1.64 (a) provides, in part, that trial
14	judges in the civil criminal division will rotate the hearing of misdemeanor appeals from
15	municipal courts on a monthly basis.
16	
17	WHEREAS, the Eighth Judicial District Court Rule 1.30 (b)(5) provides that the chief
18	judge make regular and special assignments of all judges, and hear or reassign emergency
19	matters when a judge is absent or otherwise unavailable.
20	WHEREAS, the Eighth Judicial District Court Rule 1.30 (b)(18) provides that the chie
21	judge assure that court duties are timely and orderly performed.
22	
23	WHEREAS, the Eighth Judicial District Court Rule 1.30 (b)(18)(iv) provides, in part,
24	that to facilitate the business of the court, the chief judge may delegate the duties prescribed in
25	these rules to other judges.
26	WHEREAS, the assignment of all misdemeanor appeals from municipal courts to be
27	heard by one district judge in the civil criminal division is an efficient management decision fo
28	, and an enterent management decision to

the court and the court's justice partners. The chief judge and the judges of the Eighth Judicial District Court have determined that the rotation of the hearing of misdemeanor appeals from municipal courts on a monthly basis has not been an effective allocation of judicial resources.

WHEREAS, the Rules Committee and the judges of the Eighth Judicial District Court have approved a change in EDCR 1.64 that eliminates the rotation of the hearing on misdemeanor appeals, and that a request for a change to this rule has been sent to the Nevada Supreme Court for approval.

Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the chief judge shall designate a district judge to hear all misdemeanor appeals from municipal courts.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a designated judge in the civil criminal division shall hear all misdemeanor appeals from municipal courts for as long as the chief judge determines that the interests of the district court are promoted by the use of one docket assignment for these cases.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Honorable Donald M. Mosley, District Court, Department 14, shall hear all misdemeanor appeals from municipal courts pursuant to this administrative order for the Eighth Judicial District Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Administrative Order shall be in effect on September 1, 2009, and shall continue until modified or rescinded by a subsequent Administrative Order.
