IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE MATTER OF COURTHOUSE VISITORS TRESPASSED PURSUANT TO NRS 207.200

Administrative Order: 25-05

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge is responsible for supervising the administrative business of the Eighth Judicial District Court ("EJDC"), ensuring the quality and continuity of its services, supervising its calendar, reassigning cases as convenience or necessity requires, assuring the court's duties are timely and orderly performed, and otherwise facilitating the business of the Court; NRS 3.025; EDCR 1.30(b).

WHEREAS, EJDC judges and staff occupy several public buildings in Clark County, to include the Regional Justice Center on 200 Lewis Ave. Las Vegas NV, the Family Court Complex on 601 N. Pecos Rd. Las Vegas NV, assigned areas of the Greystone Building on 1900 E. Flamingo Rd. Las Vegas NV, and assigned areas of the Phoenix Building on 330 S. 3rd St. Las Vegas NV (referred to herein individually as a "Courthouse" or collectively as "Courthouses").

WHEREAS, by way of this Administrative Order, the Chief Judge seeks to meaningfully balance visitors' right to access Courthouses and avail of their services against the need to limit the access of certain visitors who engage in disruptive behavior and thereby present a security risk or a substantial interference with the orderly flow of Courthouse business.

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WHEREAS, NRS 207.200 affords the EJDC, as a Courthouse occupant, the ability to issue a trespass warning and prohibit such visitors from returning to the Courthouse for a period of two years.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to EDCR 1.30(b), that trespass warnings, pursuant to NRS 207.200, may be issued and enforced at any Courthouse as follows:

Courthouses are public buildings; and, upon passing security screening, visitors may freely enter and remain in Courthouses during regular business hours to conduct business and observe court proceedings open to the public. However, hostile, boisterous, belligerent, vexatious or other disruptive behavior in any Courthouse that presents a threat to the safety or security of another Courthouse visitor or occupant, or which substantially interferes with the orderly flow of Courthouse business is unlawful. Visitors exhibiting any such behavior may be removed from the Courthouse and issued a trespass warning by EJDC marshals as provided by NRS 207.200(2)(e) along with a demand that the disruptive visitor leave the Courthouse.

Before issuing such a warning, EJDC marshals shall make a reasonable attempt to inform the visitor engaging in the disruptive behavior to cease the behavior. In doing so, EJDC marshals shall notify the visitor of the specific behavior that is deemed disruptive and attempt to deescalate the behavior. If the visitor persists with engaging in any further disruptive behavior, EJDC marshals shall notify the EJDC Chief Marshal, who shall evaluate the propriety of issuing a trespass warning. In doing so, the EJDC Chief Marshal shall consider the totality of the circumstances surrounding the visitor's behavior, including but not limited to: the egregiousness of the behavior, whether the visitor made threats to harm another visitor or Courthouse occupant, and whether the visitor has engaged in disruptive behavior during previous Courthouse visits. If the EJDC Chief Marshal is satisfied that issuing a trespass warning under NRS 207.200 is necessary to protect the safety of others or ensure the continued orderly flow of Courthouse business, the Chief Marshal may direct EJDC marshals to issue a trespass warning and demand the visitor leave the Courthouse. Upon issuing such a warning,

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EJDC marshals shall offer the visitor a copy of this Administrative Order, along with written material containing information on filing documents via mail or email, accessing information through the self-help center website, submitting customer service complaints and any other literature that may facilitate the visitor conducting business remotely or virtually.

Such trespass warnings are in effect for a period of two years from issuance, as provided in NRS 207.200(1)(b). However, in order to preserve visitors' rights to meaningfully access the court system and to narrowly tailor the restrictions imposed by this Administrative Order to only what is necessary to preserve safety, security and the orderly flow of business at Courthouses, EJDC marshals shall nonetheless allow a visitor with an active trespass warning to enter a Courthouse for the following purposes:

- a. to attend a hearing for any action in which the visitor is a party or a witness upon verification of the hearing and the visitor's status as a party or witness;
- b. to file a pleading or other document at the EJDC or Las Vegas Justice Court clerk's offices upon being presented with the document to be filed;
- c. to appear in any office in a Courthouse pursuant to a court order or scheduled appointment upon verification of the order or appointment;
- d. to appear and report for jury service upon verification the visitor is summoned or ordered to appear.

Visitors who are the subject of an active trespass warning shall check-in with EJDC marshals prior to going through security screening. EJDC marshals shall inquire about the visitor's need to enter the Courthouse and review any proof presented by the visitor establishing that need. If EJDC marshals determine the visitor meets any of the purposes above, the visitor shall be permitted to enter the Courthouse and may be subject to escort by an EJDC marshal. The visitor shall leave the Courthouse immediately upon conclusion of the visitor's hearing, filing, appointment, or transaction. If the visitor who is the subject of the trespass warning engages in any hostile, boisterous, belligerent, vexatious or other disruptive behavior in the Courthouse

that presents a threat to the safety or security of any other Courthouse visitor or occupant, or which substantially interferes with the orderly flow of Courthouse business, EJDC Marshals may enforce the active trespass warning and immediately escort the visitor out of the Courthouse. Visitors who are the subject of an active trespass order who do not satisfy the aforementioned criteria for Courthouse access shall be refused entry.

No provision of this Administrative Order shall be deemed to override EJDC marshals' obligation to enforce violations of law including detaining or arresting the visitor as warranted by the circumstances.
